Daily Educational Hikes in Glacier National Park

Hikes will begin July 1 and run through September 30.

Tours meet at 320 Nucleus Ave, Columbia Falls at 8:30 am and return at 4:30 pm

Hidden Lake Overlook

This option will include one of the must-see highlights in the park: Hidden Lake Overlook. This educational tour will spend time discussing the incredible geology of the area while traveling along the Going-to-the-Sun road corridor. We will also take time to learn about the fire ecology of Glacier National Park and why it's crucial for the survival of numerous species. Once we arrive at Logan Pass, we will begin our hike of the Hidden Lake Overlook trail. The alpine meadows surrounded by majestic peaks offer the unrivaled scenery to discuss wildlife habitat, Leave No Trace principles, and the importance of land stewardship.

Total Distance (roundtrip): 3 miles / Total elevation gain: 550 feet

Highline Trail

This is the ultimate hiking experience! The Highline is arguably Glacier National Park's most famous trail. Departing from Logan Pass, this trail leads you through some of the most scenic vistas in the lower 48, all while in view of billion-year-old geological features. We will wind our way up the Going-to-the-Sun road from the west entrance, taking time to learn about the geology, wildlife, and cultural history along the way. Once at Logan Pass, we will begin our hike for an in-depth look at alpine environments, wildlife habitat,

and a stunning geologic overview.

Total Distance (roundtrip): 8 miles / Total elevation gain: 825 feet

Siyeh Pass

On this hike, you'll be introduced to vast meadows painted with wildflowers and alpine trees. Leaving the office at 8:30am, we will drive up the Going-To-The-Sun Road and park at the Siyeh Bend trailhead. From there, you will begin a 6-mile round trip hike to the Preston Park area, where you will be engulfed in a magnificent glacially-carved valley. While on the trail, you will learn about the geologic history of this region, what animals might call this spot the perfect habitat, and indigenous culture that gives this area its name, "Siyeh".

Total Distance (roundtrip): 6 miles / Total elevation gain: 1,415 feet

Avalanche Lake

Join us on one of the most popular hikes in Glacier National Park! After traveling up to iconic Logan Pass, we will venture back down the Going-to-the-Sun towards Lake McDonald. We will begin our mid-day educational hike at the lush Trail of the Cedars trailhead. This boardwalk portion winds through an ancient forest, thick with western red cedars and western hemlocks. We will then continue climbing along the Avalanche Lake trail, getting a chance to marvel at avalanche blowdown, massive glacial erratics, and a glacier-fed cirque basin that leaves every hiker misty-eyed. This day program will provide in-depth education on wildlife, geology, and ecology.

Total Distance (roundtrip): 5 miles / Total elevation gain: 730 feet

Complete GTTSR

This is your complete Going-to-the-Sun road educational experience! Our day will begin at 8:30am as we head towards the park entrance in West Glacier. Along the road, we will have chances to stop and learn at such iconic sites like: Lake McDonald, Upper McDonald Creek, Trail of the Cedars, The Loop, Bird Woman Falls, Haystack Falls, Weeping Wall, Big Bend, Logan Pass, Big Drift, Jackson Glacier Overlook, Sun Point, and Rising Sun. This day program is the only one that will travel the complete Going-to-the-Sun road (and back), while taking the time to learn about geology, wildlife, and history. This experience is great for those who want less hiking, maximum sights, prime photo opportunities and the ultimate educational day.

Firebrand Pass

RAFT TRIPS

Scenic and whitewater raft trips on the Flathead River are an experience that you won't soon forget. The Middle and North Fork of the Flathead are two of Montana's wildest rivers and form the southern and western boundaries of Glacier National Park. They are protected as Wild and Scenic rivers ensuring that they will remain free-flowing and untamed. These glacial fed waters rank as some of the cleanest rivers in the world. On these adventure trips, we often see deer, mountain goats, osprey, eagles, beavers, bears, and there are times we even hear howling wolves.

Horseback Rides

See the Flathead Valley by air! Well, almost. While we can't promise you a ride on Pegasus, we do climb on our earth-bound horses to elevations where the views of the Flathead Valley, Flathead Lake, and the Swan Mountain Range are nothing less than spectacular.

Our horseback rides are all guided, and go through miles of private timberland on both horse trails and logging roads. Though we do offer shorter lesson rides for the novice rider (1 hour - \$65), our most popular ride, and the one providing the most fabulous scenery in the shortest amount of time, is our morning or afternoon ride (2 hours - \$80). We also offer a half-day horseback ride (3 hours - \$165)

On longer trail rides, we ride through mountain forests that break out onto clear plateaus with panoramic scenery, thus providing a variety of terrain.

The Western Barbecue Dinner ride is our personal favorite. Enjoy a late afternoon 1 hour horseback ride to the mountaintop, followed by relaxing around the campfire while we prepare a traditional western barbecue. Your choice of Flat Iron Steak, Chicken or Salmon. Meats are cooked over an open wood fire (veggie burgers can be substituted), and served with all the trimmings at the head of a secluded, peaceful meadow, (\$100 per person) or one hour wagon ride with BBQ. (\$85 per person)

Because we operate in the mountains, all our rides are at a walk. We provide helmets. Shoes (not sandals) are required, as well as long pants (not shorts).

Check-in is half an hour from your scheduled ride time for paperwork, payment, optional helmet fitting, and a detailed lesson prior to the ride. Bottled water is provided.

We ride twice a day, Monday-Saturday, in the morning and afternoon.

Reservations only, please call with plenty of notice as we fill up quickly.
Cancellation policy: We require a 24 hour notice from your scheduled ride time for cancelling your reservation, or we will charge the card on file.
